





## CHARITABLE NONPROFIT CORPORATION

There are four main legal steps that need to be taken to become a charitable nonprofit corporation in lowa with tax-exempt status recognized by the Internal Revenue Service.

STEPS	HOW	WHY	REMEMBER
Become a nonprofit corporation  \$20 FILING FEE	File and submit <i>Articles of Incorporation</i> to the Iowa Secretary of State.  You may also file online through <i>Fast Track Filing</i> on the Iowa Secretary of State website: https://filings.sos.iowa.gov/Account/Signup	ADVANTAGES: Incorporation reduces liability for those working for the nonprofit corporation.  • same liability protection as regular corporations and limited liability companies  • one of the easier risk management techniques available  • nonprofit corporations are liable for their debts – but the board, staff, volunteers, and others involved are not  Also, significant federal and state tax benefits are available for incorporating as a nonprofit once it receives recognition of tax exemption from the IRS.	THIS IS STEP ONE! Being a nonprofit corporation in Iowa doesn't mean you are a charitable nonprofit yet.
Apply for an Employer Identification Number (EIN) — NO FEE	Apply for an EIN through the IRS website: https://www.irs.gov/businesses/small-businesses-self-employed/apply-for-an-employer-identification-number-ein-online	An EIN can be used for several things, including opening a bank account for the nonprofit organization.  When application asks, "What type of legal structure is applying for an EIN?"  • choose the bottom option beginning with: View Additional Types  • on the next page select: Other Nonprofit/ Tax Exempt Organizations	Having an EIN does NOT mean that the IRS has recognized you as a charitable nonprofit.  Think of this like a nonprofit's "social security number," in that it gives the nonprofit corporation an identity.
Hold a board meeting and adopt Bylaws — NO FEE	Gather your board to adopt your bylaws and begin conducting official business which is recorded in organizational minutes.	Bylaws are not filed with any government entity in lowa; they are an internal document for the organization.  The bylaws must be adopted before the <b>FORM 1023</b> (application for federal nonprofit status) can be filed, as they are a requirement for the form.	Even though only one board member is required by lowa law (lowa Code 504.803), best practice is to have at least five board members (V.B.3). (recommended by lowa Principles & Practices for Charitable Nonprofit Excellence)
Submit Federal Application for Charitable Nonprofit Status —	FORM 1023 must be submitted online and requires registration for an account: https://www.pay.gov/public/form/start/704509645  - OR -  FORM 1023-EZ (for organizations with less than \$250,000 in total assets):  • to see if you are eligible, review the	BENEFIT: One of the most attractive benefits of being recognized as a charitable nonprofit is the opportunity to receive funds from donors including government grants, foundation support, and individuals.	Following review of your application, the IRS will issue your organization an official IRS Determination Letter, which decides:  • if your entity will be recognized as a charitable nonprofit – 501(c)(3)  • whether you will be
